Manuscript Submission Guidelines

(Style Sheet)

- 1. The write up should be 1.5 spaced throughout (not only the text but also displayed quotations, notes, references and any other matter). A cover page must be provided mentioning the title of the article and the author's name, addresses (both postal and e-mail), and phone numbers.
- 2. All essays must include an **Abstract** (between 250-300 words) and five (05) **keywords** at the beginning of the essay.
- 3. Referencing Style: References should be provided as endnotes. A **Reference List** (Bibliography) should provide a complete list of all references cited in the article. Do not distinguish between primary and secondary references; they must all be included in one alphabetized list.
