Introduction and Expected Learning Outcomes:

This course is intended as an introduction to the history of Sufi-Rishi movement of Kashmir. The aim is to showcase the rich spiritual heritage of Kashmir and its impact in shaping its historical trajectory. It introduces students to various *Sufi Silsilahs* that spread here as well as the role they played, with a special focus on Mir Sayyid Ali Hamadani (RA).

The second unit of this course is fully dedicated to the indigenous Sufi order of Kashmir, the *Rishi silsilah* and its founder Shaikh-ul Aalam (RA), regarded as the 'Patron saint of Kashmir'. It intends to introduce Shaikh-ul Aalam (RA) and his body of work strictly through a 'Knowledge Perspective', before the younger generation of Kashmir. A discussion on the role of the Muslim Rishis and Islam in Kashmir forms a part of the module.

This course is an Open Elective one. Students from all academic streams can opt for it in order to have a glimpse of the history of rich spiritual heritage of Kashmir.
